1. President's Report

I'm pleased to report that CRCC has had another great year on and off the water. Although our membership numbers have dipped from 111 last year to 85, I believe the club is in really good shape.

The club continues to enjoy a sound financial position (Refer to accounts attached). These accounts have been audited by club member Mike Galanty. The club has made several investments over the past year which all contribute to the development of the club. Firstly there have been a number of expenses in relation to the Kent Street Boat shed which are capital expenses such as installation of alarm, fire systems, locks and boat racks. These are one off costs totalling around \$4,500 that were necessary to make the boat shed a functional asset for our club. In addition the club has purchased a number of boats and paddles including a plastic playboat, a 515 plastic Double and a carbon racing K2. These are all important investments for

the club to firstly be able to offer its membership a facility and boats, but also importantly to have a base from which to operate. This is particularly import for the development of guppies, who we hope will go on to become the future of our sport.

We are possibly one of the only paddling clubs to have a winter residence and a summer residence, with the use of the Shelley Sailing club over the past winter. I'd like to acknowledge Dave Brown for the work he has done to facilitate this relationship with the Shelley Sailing Club which has proved to be a very popular move — particularly on those cold, wet nights. This is no doubt a far cry from huddling inside the Riverton Bridge Gazebo. We are fortunate that we will be permitted to use this facility again next year and continue in developing our relationship with the Shelley Sailing Club.

On the water many of our members have continued to succeed in paddling events outside the club events. As usual I won't go through these achievements here but wait until our awards presentation lunch coming up in the next month or so.

The club has also continued to sponsor training of our members in coaching and instruction. We believe this is an important part of our development and encourage our members to approach the committee to learn more about how we as a club can support you in becoming skilled in these areas.

Club events

We have continued to run two main events being the Canning Classic and the Canning Nomination. Both events continue to be well attended and contribute significantly to our annual fundraising and we will therefore continue to run these events during the next season. We raised \$1,185 from these two events.

Training Squad

We have developed the Kent Street Saturday morning training squad program over the past year and look like developing this even further over the next 12 months. A big thank you to Jerry Alderson who looked after the seniors and to Jamie Ingram and Ken Ringrose who helped me with the guppies/juniors. It was particularly pleasing to see two of our Guppies Oneli and Levi progress to compete in the Junior Avon a couple of months ago.

I'd also like to mention the efforts of Dave Brown and Jamie Ingram in supporting some disabled paddlers over the course of the season. This can be very difficult, particularly in a water based activity, requiring incredible patience and understanding.

Over the next season Jerry will continue to run the senior group, Ken will look after the juniors and Jamie will attempt to keep the Guppies in line. We had 7 guppies down last Saturday which is an encouraging sign.

Come and Try

Dave Brown has continued to run the come and try sessions which has resulted in introducing a number of people to paddling, many of which have gone on to become Members.

Volunteers

Although it goes without saying that our club cannot run without the overwhelming generous donation of time by volunteers. I as I said last year our volunteers are second to none and truly go above and beyond just doing the bare minimum to keep a club running. While there are too many to name here I would like to specifically acknowledge the work done by our committee over the past year. We will celebrate the work done by our volunteers at next month's award lunch.

To sum up, there is plenty to look forward to in the next 12 months and Canning River Canoe Club will continue to be an integral part of the paddling scene here in Perth. We like to think that we are an inclusive club that can meet the needs of all our paddling members, be it hard core racing or simply a Sunday afternoon drift down the river. While our club has not necessarily grown in numbers over the past year, I believe it has developed.
